
## Minutes of Meeting: 29 June 2005

1. A meeting of the NYAOG was scheduled on 29 Jun 05 at 1730hrs. at The Pier View Restaurant in Yonkers, N.Y. Due to inclement weather, the **start** of the meeting was delayed until 1815 hrs.
2. Members in attendance: Leo Cunningham, Scott Fenstermaker, Edmund Rossnagel and Michael Galbreath.
3. The primary item on the agenda was the consideration, formation and adoption of a CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS for the New York Chapter. After an intensive session of discussion and revision of positions the members present hammered out and adopted a Constitution and By-Laws – a copy of which is attached to these minutes.
4. For the initial “resurrection” of the NY Chapter, the following members were elected/appointed to the below mentioned positions.

Next a review of past Chapter events and accomplishments was held and then followed a short discussion of future activities both within just the NYC Chapter itself and the possibilities of combining events with other chapters and the other Service Academies’ graduate associations. Understandably, this portion was more of a “brainstorming” activity than an action item.
6. One final, significant action was taken at this meeting. In support of last year’s tailgate party in support of the Air Force/Army game at West Point, Leo Cunningham incurred considerable, out-of-pocket expenses in regard to catering arrangements, coordination with other chapters and other Academies’ organizations. Mike Galbreath proposed a motion that Mr. Cunningham be permitted to reimburse himself for these expenses from NYAOG funds. The motion was seconded by Ed Rossnagel and approved unanimously.
7. At 2015 hrs. Leo Cunningham moved to adjourn and the motion was seconded by Scott Fenstermaker with unanimous approval following.
